

A. Criteria for KOLMAN AWARD

(Adopted October 13, 1999; Amended January 10, 2002)

1. At least ten years active membership in AIA and AIA Savannah (South Georgia);
2. Service to AIA Savannah (South Georgia), in particular as an officer, committee chair, volunteer, or in carrying out special projects, consistently;
3. Service to the community in roles which utilize the special talents and abilities of an architect; and
4. High ethical standards in practice and in conduct.

C. Selection Process:

This award should be given very sparingly and only when someone really deserves special recognition. It is also expensive to cast. The award should be given no more often than every four years and then only when truly deserved. The less often it is given, the more important it becomes. We have the following process in place for future nominations and selection.

1. Nominations from General Membership to the Executive Committee;
2. Additional Nominees from the Executive Committee;
3. Forwarded to an anonymous Review Committee to determine if any are deserving and to consider others they feel should be considered; and
4. Selection.

The anonymous Review Committee should be made up of previous recipients, the current AIA Savannah President, the current Awards Chair and enough other members appointed by the President to equal no less than five and no more than the number of participating past recipients, should they exceed five, the President and the Awards Committee Chair. No Award nominee shall serve on the Committee. In the event that a member of the Committee, including the President and the Awards Committee Chair, becomes a nominee, the President shall appoint a replacement.
